c. Geopolitical analysis

Burkina Faso is one of the poorest countries on the planet. Its most vulnerable inhabitants are often illiterate and suffer from a lack of access to healthcare and low spending power.

The most vulnerable populations, and people with disabilities in particular, receive almost no medical assistance and have very little involvement in the country's economic and social life. Their fundamental rights, including access to education, professional training and employment etc. are often not upheld. The vast majority therefore find themselves excluded and suffering from extreme poverty.

The demographic growth in the capital Ouagadougou, which now has more than 1.5 million inhabitants, has resulted in numerous problems (pollution, security, transport infrastructure, health, etc.).



Presence of HI in the country

Burkina Faso was the first African country HI worked in. The organisation was officially registered in 1991. That year, the organisation worked on renovating the CNAOB (Burkina National Centre for Orthopaedic Fitting), in partnership with the Ministry of Health. It subsequently supported the development and creation of other rehabilitation and orthopaedic fitting centres throughout the country. The scope of HI's interventions in Burkina Faso continued to expand over the years.

Today, HI facilitates the implementation of a regional functional rehabilitation network and the integration of this network into the national health system. Handicap International also trains health and functional rehabilitation professionals. Thanks to its education project, the organisation is facilitating children with disabilities' access to primary school and helping keep them in education. In order to ensure the sustainability of this project, the organisation trains and raises the awareness of actors in the disability and inclusive education sectors.

HI also supports vulnerable populations in Burkina Faso: households in the north region facing food insecurity with the RESA project (building resilience to food insecurity in the Sahel region); prisoners through the FORS project (personalised support for prisoners to facilitate their reintegration); people with disabilities with HIV through the HIV and disability project which aims to ensure the rights and needs of people with disabilities are taken into account in HIV control initiatives.

The organisation also works alongside schools coping with insecurity in the Sahel region, notably by putting into place preparedness and response plans in schools, as well as providing psychosocial support for teachers who are the victims of attacks by armed groups.
