b. Geopolitical analysis

With particularly high demographic growth (+3%/year) despite a slight downwards trend (2.5% in 2030), 80% of the Malagasy population lives in rural areas which concentrate 85% of the country's poverty. The capital Antananarivo is home to 30% of the population and 56.6% are young people under the age of 20 years.

The year 2017 was marked by preparations for the elections, notably the Presidential elections scheduled for 2018, with the political actors all jockeying for position.

The security situation in the country deteriorated in 2017, when there was a significant increase in kidnappings and organised crime. According to the local media, this situation is due to the failings of the judicial system and the ineffectiveness of the security services, due to the corruption rife throughout the country and which undermines people's faith in the institutions.

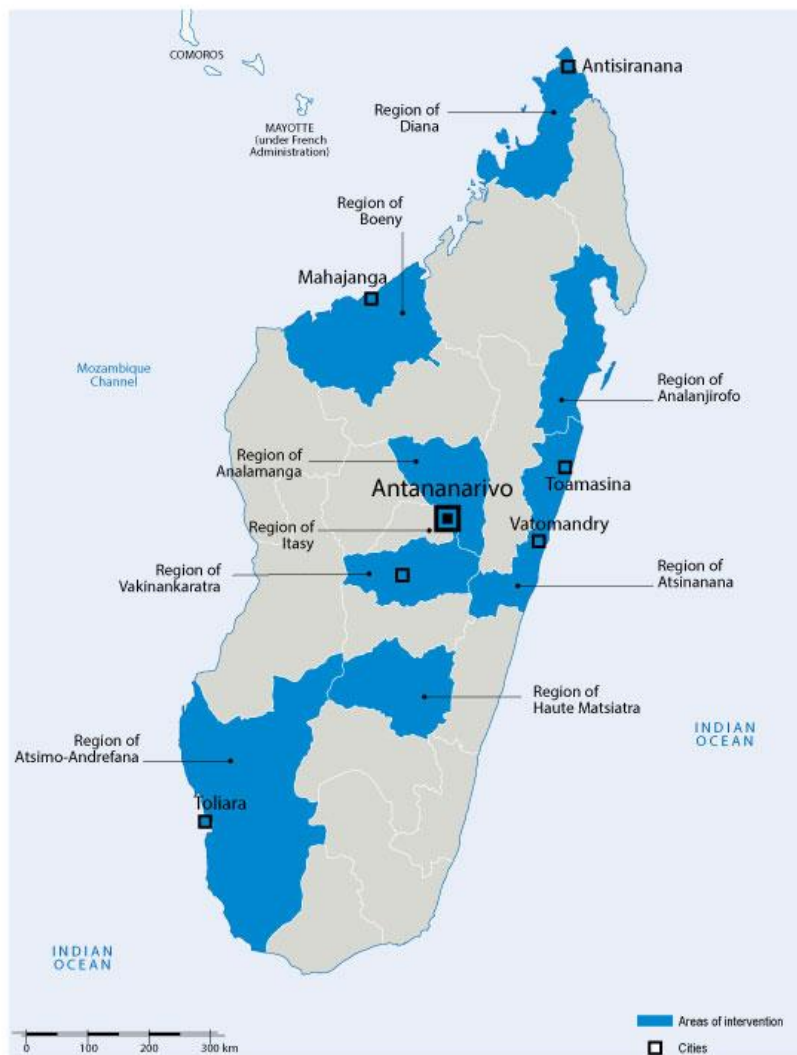
